This quilt uses 2 sizes of rectangles to make a square: 3.5" X 6.5" and 3.5" X 9.5" rectangles. To make 35 blocks, you need 105 rectangles at 3.5" X 6.5" and 35 rectangles at 3.5" X 9.5". This gives you a 45" X 63" quilt or 51" X 69" quilt with a border that finishes at 3".

Sew 3 small rectangles together along the long sides, giving you a unit that is 6.5" X 9.5". Press the seams towards the center rectangle.

Sew the long side of the large rectangle to the long side of a unit from above, giving you a 9.5" square as shown to the right. Press the seam towards the large rectangle. Make 35 squares.



Lay out the blocks into 7 rows of 5 blocks, rotating every other block as shown below. There are other ways you can rotate the blocks to get different looks. Try out various options to see which one you like best.



If you want the larger quilt, cut 6 WOF border strips at 3.5". Sew strips together to make borders and sew to quilt.
