

Splitting Squares



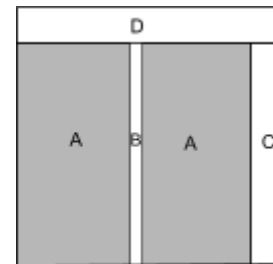
Quilt made using 8.5" squares, 2.0" strips, and 1" strips
 Approximate Quilt size: 47" x 57"

Materials Needed

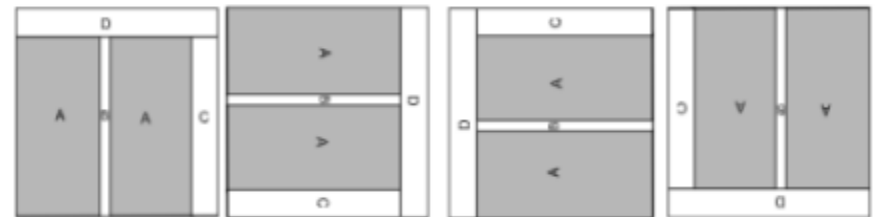
- **From Assorted Print Fabrics**
 - 30 - 8.5" squares
 - cut in half to make 30 pairs of 4.25" x 8.5" rectangles (Fabric A)
- **From Background Fabric**
 - 6 - 1.0" width of fabric strips cut into:
 - 30 - 1" x 8.5" rectangles (Fabric B)
 - 14 - 2.0" width of fabric strips cut into:
 - 30 - 2.0" x 8.5" rectangles (Fabric C)
 - 30 - 2.0" x 10.0" rectangles (Fabric D)

Sewing Instructions

1. Sew the blocks together as shown in the picture below.



2. Rotate the block by 90° increments so that you have the appropriate number of each block type.



9 blocks

6 blocks

9 blocks

6 blocks

Rows 1,3 and 5

Rows 2, 4 and 6

3. Alternate the blocks and sew them into rows as shown on the front of the card. Make 6 rows.
4. Sew the 6 rows together.

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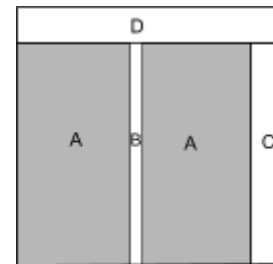
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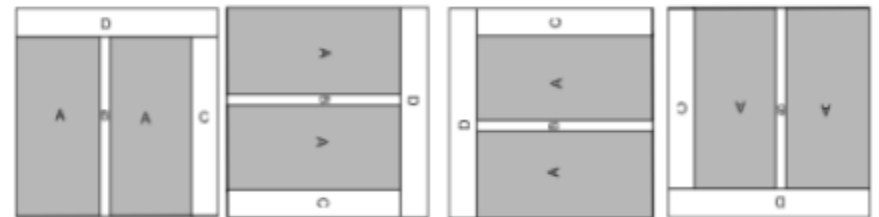
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
